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Generalized Pustular Psoriasis (GPP): a rare autoinflammatory skin disease

GPP is a rare autoinflammatory skin disease with episodes of Flares.

GPP can affect the body in many different ways and not everyone will experience exactly the same symptoms. There might be painful, pus-filled blisters (called pustules), along with red, dry, cracked or scaly skin, and severe itching.

GPP is not contagious and does not spread from person to person

GPP can lead to life threatening complications - heart failure, renal failure, sepsis, often requiring emergency care
